Translating the interaction between verse and code was a challenge as a developer working across devices, but it came together harmoniously!



Video with closed captions and descriptive audio, audio files with in-page transcripts (Audio Text), and images with alternative text are all used as a part of activities to help students learn a foreign language and test their skills.

HOW DID YOU MAKE IT ACCESSIBLE?

VHL uses the standards established in Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794d) and W3C (WCAG 2.1 AA) guidelines to evaluate and



improve its digital products. VHL partners with QA Infotech (QAIT) which pairs sighted and non-sighted test engineers together to help ensure product testing mirrors the actual user experience for our learning solutions. We formed a crossfunctional team of editors, producers, product managers,

and engineers to evaluate the known issues, discover existing short-comings, and develop a plan to address the problems systematically.





DESIGNERS' COMMENTS VHL builds products using universal-design so all students have an equal opportunity to achieve their learning goals. Our virtual chat activity is a perfect example of this. We transformed the activity to allow the user to drive the experience by choosing how they complete the activity: Automatic Mode or Manual Mode. Automatic mode is the original automatically advancing activity plus improved keyboard navigation. Manual Mode allows the student to listen to the prompt again, record their response multiple times, then choose to move to the next prompt when they are ready, resolving overlapping audio issues for visually-impaired users.

This language textbook
adds multimedia elements
including video and audio for
pronunciation but applies a
layer of accessibility to allow for
user to interact with the content
using VoiceOver commands
and screenreaders like JAWS.



HOW DOES THE THEME SPEAK TO DIVERSITY/ INCLUSION TODAY?

Dr. Mario Molina is a real-life hero whose story shows how one brave Latinx scientist helped save the planet. As an American citizen of Mexican descent. Dr. Molina faced fierce, sometimes racist attacks when he tried to warn the world about the hole in the ozone layer. Dr. Molina refused to give up, though, and his efforts eventually led to a global treaty to heal the ozone hole. Today he continues to speak truth to power, urging the world to unite against climate change. He also supports young scientists from developing countries. As he puts it, "You never know which young, bright mind holds the solution to a serious problem we face in the world. We need every one."



WHY IS THIS STORY IMPORTANT?

Young readers of all backgrounds need to see strong, successful Latinx protagonists in books. Mario Molina was a child from Mexico City who grew up to be a brilliant chemist, a Nobel laureate, and a recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom. We hope Dr. Molina's story inspires young Latinx readers to dream big and challenge harmful stereotypes of just who can be a scientist.

Dr. Molina told the publisher what kind of dog he had as a child so the illustrator could get it right.






DESIGNERS' COMMENTS We were so happy when Teresa Martínez agreed to illustrate this book. Since we were doing Spanish and English editions at the same time, I typeset both and sent her the (longer) Spanish pages to sketch into. We then used layers in InDesign to set up both editions for the printer. Teresa's page designs are dynamic and her characterization of Mario is wonderful. As a Mexican illustrator, she was also able to bring warmth and authenticity to the scenes set in the Mexico City of Mario's childhood.


